Today the Council gathers an even greater diversity of religious leaders and institutions, enriched by the participation of such as Mormon, Muslim and Quaker faith communities, the Community Renewal Society and the Chicago Center for Cultural Connections (formerly the National Conference of Christians and Jews, NCCJ, and most recently leaders of the Baha'i, Hindu, Jain, Sikh and Zoroastrian traditions. To the best of our knowledge, CRLMC is unique as a continuing inter-religious organization in the nation and likely in the world. By uniting the churches, synagogues, temples, mosques, and other religious assemblies, CRLMC seeks to present a unified vision and voice on issues affecting the common good of the people of Chicago.
